Larry Lee Cole, 73, of Idaho Falls, passed away Thursday, Jan. 27, 2011, at Eastern Idaho Regional Medical Center.

Larry was born May 7, 1937, in Mason City, Neb., to Floyd Cole and Neva Woolsey Cole. His birth father passed away when Larry was 2 years old, and his mother remarried Floyd Pete Mortensen, who helped raise Larry.

On July 7, 1954, he married Naomi Jane Goldsberry in Idaho Falls. Together they raised three children. Larry was involved with the Veterans Motor Car Club of America (VMCCA), Past President of the Eastern Idaho Chapter, and a member of the Studebaker Drivers Club.

Larry worked in the automotive industry in auto body repair and restoration. He enjoyed working on cars, fishing, hunting, snowmobiling and riding motorcycles. He loved the outdoors and spending time with his family.

Survivors include his wife, Naomi of Idaho Falls; daughters, Carol Jane (Raymond) Landcaster of Illinois and Shari Marie Cole of California; son, Roy (Ruth Anne) Cole of Idaho Falls; mother, Neva Mortensen; five grandchildren; and eight great-grandchildren.

The family visited with friends from 6 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. Tuesday at Wood Funeral Home, 273 N. Ridge Ave., and one hour prior to services at the church. Burial was in Fielding Memorial Park under the direction of Wood Funeral Home.

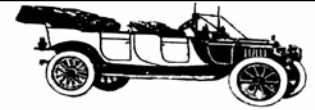

MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

- March 10, 2011 EI-VMCCA meeting was called to order by Mike Derbidge at 7:00 p.m. -
- Terry and Joanna Anderson, Bonneville Region, were introduced as meeting guests.
- Gregory P. Schwartzberger passed away on March 4, with memorial services to be held Saturday March 12. - The scheduled club breakfast and trip to EITC has been cancelled and will be rescheduled for possibly in May.
- February meeting minutes were read and approved.
- Bud and Janet Chaney reported on the upcoming Swap Meet. Yale spoke with Dana at Army Surplus Store about rope and was referred to CAL Ranch where 400' of rope was purchases. Vendors are calling to reserve spaces and the city will be contacted to finalize securing the hockey building. Janet indicated she will be asking for start-up money for food/advertising. Bud has been giving out some of the colored brochures to businesses and Ray is to check to see if he can send out the colored brochures to members by e-mail (copy of this brochure was given to Terry and Joanna). Terry asked if any problems have been encountered with getting insurance information from National and if so to contact him.
- Mark Bunce indicated he was presented with a 1957 Chevy and all 8" of it is very nice.
- Currently 19 cars registered for the Regional Tour and the motel (Best Western in Driggs) is fully booked and Super 8 motel is set for the overflow. Due to early high number of car registrations does club want to set car/person limitation? Mark S. indicated person limitation on Phillips Lodge for Saturday lunch is 60-70 persons so this may put limit on this. A limit of 35 cars was proposed and was seconded and approved by members, and continue to maintain same end date of registration. A waiting list will be created when the 35 car limit is reached. Current registration indicates refunds can be made up to June 25th and if this occurs persons on waiting list will be contacted at that time.
- Sam Otero indicated a draft has been presented to ISU asking the scholarship fund be changed from Tri-City to EI-VMCCA. Car club members and their children have initial consideration for these funds. Sam said he will also continue as the donor chair for this fund.
- Mike D. indicated there is new Ambassador Membership Program VMCCA is promoting to provide rewards to members who refer/bring in new members (rewards being pin, license plate frame, tote bags) for the various levels of the program. Members were encouraged to get memberships for their children. Ray will forward the e-mail he received from National detailing the new program. Mike also indicated that 1986 is the current year for vehicles to be considered by VMCCA.
- Terry Anderson presented information from the President's 2010 Report. National is currently on budget with a + balance. The Treasurer is again predicting a deficit for the coming year, but hopefully this will improve thru the year. An audit was conducted on the treasurer and found all records to be in order. The poll regarding a club name change showed a 50/50 split for and against. The issue has been declared dead. Publication VP is asking for more articles from members on car restorations and historical articles. Encouraged more use of the national website to access such things as the Tour Guidelines, which have been updated. The Technical VP announced 18 National Awards for 2010, one of which is for Cache Valley member Otto Derr for his 1936 Chrysler Airstream. Terry asked for more regional submissions for national awards. The Board has approved the printing of a new membership roster. It will be funded with specific funds for this purpose and by selling advertising with no cost to the national club treasury. Full details of this report will be available in next issue of Bulb Horn. Terry indicated that Dennis Holland has pictures posted from the meeting in Dallas (esp. of the new Dallas Stadium) on the club website.
- Terry and Joanna Anderson then presented Betty Born with a Certificate of Appreciation for her role as the Bonneville Region Treasurer.
- Mark S. indicated the Dust Off Tour is scheduled for April 16th and will involve a tour of the Anheuser Busch Processing plant and then a drive to Blackfoot with lunch at Rupe's Drive Inn and stop at the Idaho Potato Museum in Blackfoot. A stop at Ike lkard's home and shop will finish up the tour as members head home.

- John Dawdy referenced a Post Register article as to the use of gasohol in cars and the age of cars in which this fuel should be utilized. Bud Cheney also indicated a concern he has recently noted in the use of newer gas that may have attained the status of "old gas" (up to six months old), indicating this gas tends to form a shellac that will mess up the valves in the engine. If putting cars into winter storage plan on draining gas and/or plan on running the engine throughout the winter to aid with prevention of this problem. Make sure the engine gets up to normal operating temp before shutting down to insure this potential valve coating gets burned off completely.
- Mark S. indicated that the current bank balance for the club is \$XXXXX.XX.
- A motion was made to adjourn the meeting which was seconded and approved.
