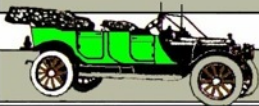

MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

July 14, 2011 EI Chapter of VMCCA meeting was called to order by Mike Derbidge –

- Thanks to all for the help provided on the recent regional tour, got great feedback from many participants. Win Paulson was acknowledged as a visiting guest with Glenn Miller. Minutes from June meeting were read and approved. Treasurer's report was provided
- Swap Meet report was given by Lynn Erickson: Lynn indicated that it had gone well even though several vendors did not show

TVR tour report provided by Brian Edgerton: 51 cars participated in the tour with 115-120 participants. Teton Mtn View Lodge prep was good and Brian indicated that most of the meals were very good with some concerns expressed on the fare of wild game on Friday dinner/Dutch oven and entertainment on Saturday evening was great/Sunday banquet was appreciated and some interesting awards were presented.

- Need to submit an article to the Bulb Horn and asked for volunteers to help develop this article. Total receipts for car/riders totaled \$7035. Need to get all receipts for various costs/events (e.g. Phillips Lodge, coffee stops, awards, S'mores, name badges, plates/silverware, etc.) Knotty Pine restaurant complimentary lunch of Friday went well and a check for \$100 was provided from the club as a gratuity, Lunch provided at Phillips Lodge was a "No Host" offering and only 88 of 101 meals provided were actually paid. A motion was made and approved for the club to pay the additional meals

- Per Brian's initial accounting the total budget was approximately \$732 over-budget
- Lessons learned from the tour. Having day leads for each of the day tours was good
- Journal provided with contact names/maps was good; however some participant's did not use and followed the car/person in front of them which did lead to some off-tour experiences.
- Tour registration ceiling needs to be made and adhered to (e.g. original car limit of 35 was eventually raised to 51 cars) and need to adhere to the set cut-off date
- Communicate clearly of the "host/no host" status of meal provision
- Use of tickets for meals was good but be sure to clearly communicate ticket colors and that all tickets must be submitted (i.e. not just 1 ticket for all participant's in a vehicle)

Suggestions: Last day tour meeting should be scheduled earlier than 10:00 a.m. (many of remaining participant's had already taken off)

- Having evening meals hosted was good so people don't get lost trying to fend for themselves trying to locate places to eat
- Be sure to communicate to participant's to READ the daily tour booklet/journal – COMMUNICATE
- Communication with phone coverage was a problem do to loss of signal with a suggestion to look at use of satellite phone in future tours
- Open seating at the awards banquet was cited as good as it did allow for people to better mingle with other participant's and not just with people in the same club

Unfinished Business

- Article X Dissolution addition to the By Laws was presented by Mike D with a motion to approve made, voted on and approved

New Business

- Mike D indicated that the Regional Meeting is our Chapter responsibility to sponsor and set up. This meeting is usually held in October and usually does occur in Utah (mostly due to its central location). Suggestions were made as to looking at Brigham City UT, Lava Hot Springs ID, Idaho Falls ID. A suggestions was made to have the Board of Directors address this and come to a decision (a motion was made on this, voted on and approved). Mike D will facilitate this. Mike indicated that he spoke with Terry Anderson (current Regional Director) and Terry has told him of his desire to retire from this position, after 6 years. Mike indicated that if anyone is interested or know of someone who may be interested to let him know.

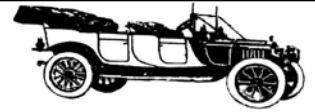

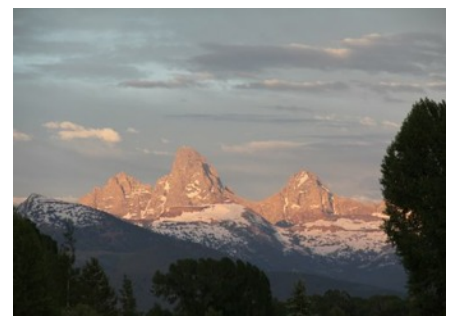

Did you know that on August 19, 1909 automotive engineer Louis Schwitzer won the two-lap, five mile inaugural race at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway in Indianapolis, Indiana? 12,000 spectators watched as Schwitzer drove a stripped-down Stoddard Dayton touring car with a four-cylinder engine. He achieved a speed of 57.4 miles an hour on the new track which was paved with crushed pieces of rock layered and bound with tar. Later, the speedway would be covered with 3.2 million paving bricks, which earned it its enduring nickname, "The Brickyard". Mike Derbidge
